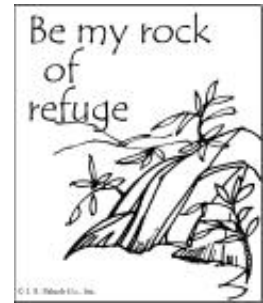

STEWARDSHIP... The first disciples of Jesus in today's Gospel left their work and their daily routines to follow him. They abandoned their livelihoods, familiar surroundings and the lives to which they had become accustomed to be closer to him. The good steward finds ways to be removed from what may be a comfortable existence or daily routine in order to serve the Lord more faithfully. All too often, out of fear, insecurity or even selfishness, we refuse to leave the safe cocoon of existence we have created for ourselves in order to hear the Lord's call and be challenged by his Gospel. Perhaps we should reflect on what comforts we need to sacrifice in order to be better stewards of God's compassionate life.

GOD'S WORD TODAY

Today, we are once again given an account of the call of the disciples. These Gospel stories are positioned in the early part of Ordinary Time for good reason. We know that the Lenten journey is just around the corner. That journey will take us once again to Jerusalem and to the cross and resurrection of Christ. One of the characteristics of discipleship is that one does not become a disciple solely on one's own. There is always a call, an invitation to follow the way of discipleship. When today's Gospel is proclaimed, try to put yourself in the place of those early disciples who were casting their nets. They were simply doing their daily tasks. In the middle of those tasks, the Lord calls them. Perhaps that is precisely where the Lord calls each of us - in the midst of our daily tasks. As we prepare to listen to God's word, let us open our hearts to listen to the invitation issued to each of us to follow in the footsteps of Christ.

The William H. (Bill) Simon Scholarship Fund awards scholarships to Catholic students who are in financial need for the purpose of attending an accredited college or university of the student's choice. The scholarship is \$ 1,000 per semester to assist the student in meeting educational needs. Scholarship funds are paid directly to the institution or to the student upon presentation of receipts paid to the institution for tuition, fees, and/or room and board. It is the intent to award three new scholarships each year; however, the actual number of new awards will be contingent upon the current number of previous recipients that are eligible for renewal.

Criteria

To be eligible to receive the Simon Scholarship, the student must meet the following criteria:

You (or your family) must be a registered Catholic in the Jefferson City Diocese.

You must complete a scholarship application in full.

You must obtain a written letter of recommendation from a school official (e.g. teacher, counselor, principal, coach) and your current or past parish priest/pastoral administrator.

You must demonstrate financial need. You will be required to submit a copy of your Student Aid Report (SAR). This report is generated through the completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available at all guidance and financial aid offices and at most libraries. It may also be filed electronically via the Internet.

The deadline for submission of the application, SAR, and letters of recommendation is **March 31, 2015** (if sending via post, it must be postmarked by March 31, 2015). All applicants will be notified of the results by May 1, 2015. To request an application, contact the parish office
