### World Mission Sunday

#### *My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,*

Each year we remember in a special way our Baptismal call to mission as we celebrate World Mission Sunday.

In our Masses next weekend we will join Catholics throughout the world in a celebration of evangelization. Through our prayers and concrete acts of solidarity, we will commit ourselves to bringing the gift of faith to all

This year marks the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Second Vatican Council's Decree on the Missionary Activity of the Church (*Ad Gentes*) which proclaims, "The pilgrim Church on earth is missionary by its very nature," reminding us that all of us are called to be on mission.

In his message for World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis writes, "Mission is part of the 'grammar' of faith, something essential for those who listen to the voice of the Spirit who whispers 'Come' and 'Go forth.' Those who follow Christ cannot fail to be missionaries..."

On World Mission Sunday, our diocesan family responds to the voice of the Spirit and connects with our world on mission:

...with *Africa*, where six million children receive an education in some 16,000 Catholic elementary schools

...with *Asia*, where those who are sick are provided with loving care at 5,000 Catholic hospitals and small clinics

...with the *Americas*, where catechists travel to remote areas to bring the Good News of the God's great love to families

Your financial help on World Mission Sunday supports pastoral and educational efforts in 1,150 young mission dioceses in our world, reaching the poorest communities with a message of hope and healing, mercy and peace.

Pope Francis emphasizes that "mission is a passion for Jesus and at the same time a passion for his people." Let us have that same passion this World Mission Sunday, as we share the joy of the Gospel and help the poor by our fervent prayer and through generous hearts!

## ***The Deep Breath of Prayer***

Spend a few minutes each day in quiet prayer. Create space. Open your heart and really listen. Jesus speaks in the stillness. Find the fullness of Christ's peace in prayer, and cultivate a grateful, generous heart.

1. Gratitude: Thank God for whatever you are grateful for today.
2. Awareness: Talk to God about the past 24 hours. What went well and not so well? What did you learn?
3. Significant Moments: Identify one significant experience today. Explore how God is speaking to you through a particular event or person.
4. Peace: Ask God to forgive you for any wrongdoing and to fill you with peace.
5. Freedom: Speak to God about how He is inviting you to change your life for the better.
6. Others: Pray for others and ask God to bless and guide them.
7. Finish by praying the Our Father.

## **WHO CARES ABOUT MONEY?**

Mark 10:17-30 *"How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!"*

Followers of Jesus in the early church were just as anxious about their material possessions as today's believers are. This string of teachings about taking ownership of our things lightly wouldn't have been delivered if the questions never arose. A lot of us are like the man in the gospel story: we're pretty good about obeying the rules. But when it comes to creature comforts, we rarely meet one we don't like, and we don't give any of them up without a fight.

Throughout the history of the church, there has never been a flood of people selling everything they have and giving the proceeds to the poor. Some few do. Francis of Assisi comes to mind. And Philadelphia heiress Katharine Drexel. There have been many more who take vows of personal poverty but live quite well in communally held splendor. Jesus himself admits that, for human beings, it is frankly impossible to enter God's reign when money and its benefits command center stage in our lives. Poverty is not a virtue, but letting go of worldly wealth is. Is it easy or hard for me to share the wealth with those less fortunate?

***STEWARDSHIP IS...Spending Time with God...*** Stewardship involves spending time with God. Recognizing that every day is a gift from God, we strive to spend some of each day with God, through prayer, Mass Eucharistic Adoration, scripture reading, quiet, meditation and other spiritual activities.

***Sharing Talent...*** Stewardship involves sharing talent. Recognizing that God has given each individual unique skills and talents so that together we can do the work of Our Lord, we strive to share our talents and to encourage and welcome others to use their talents to carry out the mission and ministry of the Church.

***Giving Treasure...*** Stewardship involves giving treasure. Giving time and talent does not excuse us from giving treasure. We know that throughout the Gospels, Jesus challenged us to give as it has been given to us. Recognizing the tremendous financial blessings that abound in our country, we strive to give at least 10% of our resources back to God, to support the building up of God's kingdom. Although this level of giving may not be immediately possible, we are aware of what percentage we are giving back and regularly strive to increase the amount, taking small, incremental steps toward giving a full tithe.

***Trust In God...*** Stewardship is trusting God. We believe that our generous God will always provide for us. None of us will ever have all we want, but we will always have all that we need.

***A Love Response...*** Once we allow God to truly take up residence in our hearts we become so overwhelmed by His abundant love for us that we just naturally feel the need to join our lives with Him and dedicate our time, talent and treasure to carrying out God's work here on earth. Our generosity comes from within and not from any external pressure or reward.
