October 26, 2015 - Stewardship Meeting Minutes

Fr Mike opened the meeting with Prayer and reading of the Holy Family Stewardship Prayer.

Our theme for November is "Gratitude".

John W. read the story of St Francis Cabrini and Andy T. read us the Diocesan definition of Gratitude.

DeAnne W. asked that all members set aside an hour of adoration in November, to pray for greater understanding of Stewardship in our parish.

The team reviewed the Time Talent and Treasure form, prepared by Janice R. and Shelly L. , to be used in November during Commitment Sunday. After review and suggestions, a message for Fr Mike will be added and form will be complete. Sign up sheet was circulated to handle distribution of this form during the homily . Follow up plans were discussed and accountability will be established to insure everyone is contacted who expresses an interest in any of our parish ministries.

HF Stewardship Book was distributed to the members present. This book will be given to each family following the Masses Oct 31st and Nov 1st. DeAnne W. explained the process used and advised the group that James O'Donnell generously worked with us and donated the production and cost of the 500 copies of this book. Like all things there were still a few errors in the final draft but we will note those for future copies as needed.

Discussion and review of the Parish Picnic was positive and some recommendations for future events lead us to a decision to continue to be involved in the annual event. Stewardship will work with the parish Picnic Committee and form their committee in March of next year to allow more time for planning.

There will be a Technology Committee forming to review all communications and make recommendations to Fr Mike for upgrades. . A brief meeting was held following our regular meeting. John Watkins will chair this committee. Please contact him if you have an interest in being involved in this work.

Stewardship will not meet in November but will have an abbreviated meeting and social on Dec 8th following the Mass for the Feast of Immaculate Conception at 5:30pm. Please watch the bulletin for details.

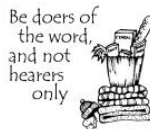

Money for "Shine a Light on Autism" (raised by Hannibal High's DECA program) is in the Bag.

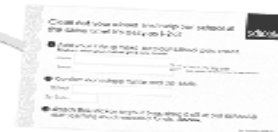

Drop the bag off with its new friends at the Hannibal Career Center (located behind the High School) between October 10th and November 15th.

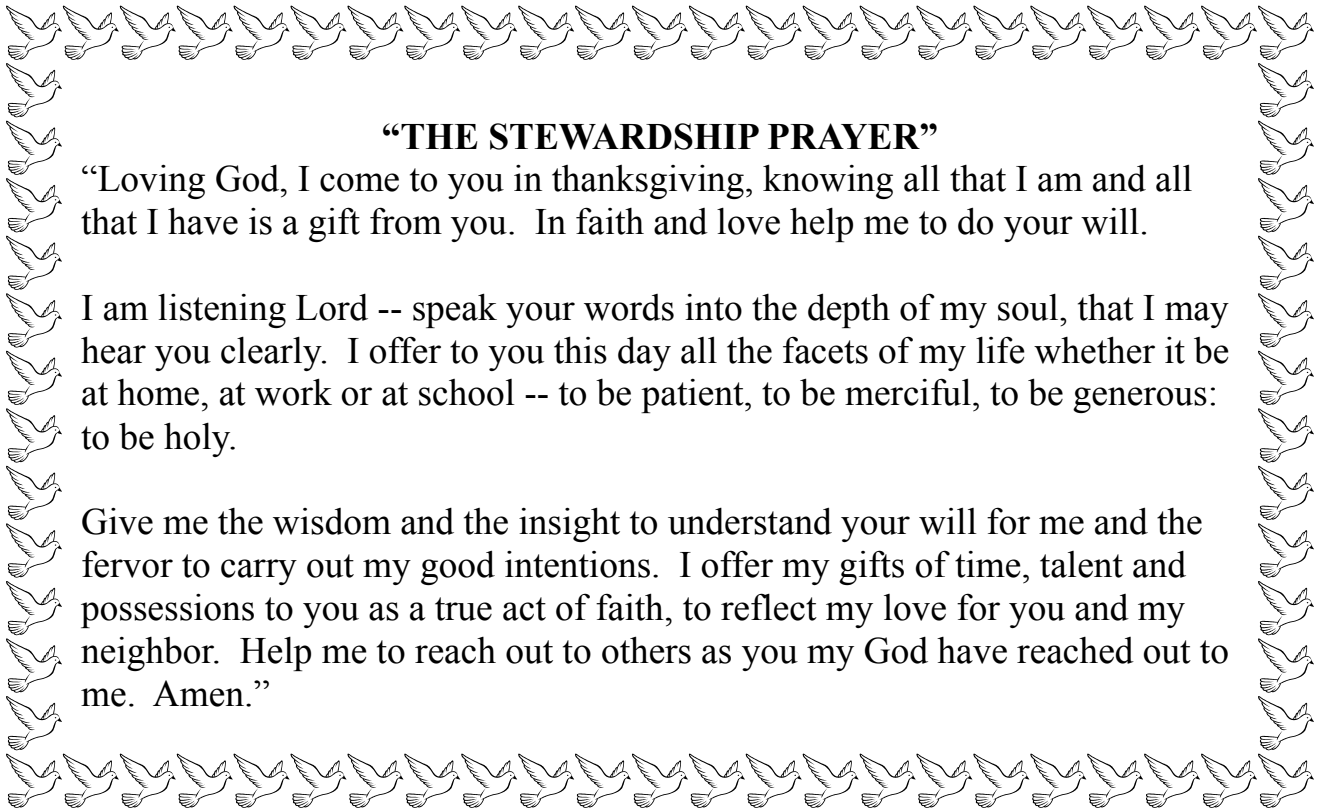

“THE STEWARDSHIP PRAYER”

“Loving God, I come to you in thanksgiving, knowing all that I am and all that I have is a gift from you. In faith and love help me to do your will.

I am listening Lord -- speak your words into the depth of my soul, that I may hear you clearly. I offer to you this day all the facets of my life whether it be at home, at work or at school -- to be patient, to be merciful, to be generous: to be holy.

Give me the wisdom and the insight to understand your will for me and the fervor to carry out my good intentions. I offer my gifts of time, talent and possessions to you as a true act of faith, to reflect my love for you and my neighbor. Help me to reach out to others as you my God have reached out to me. Amen.”

WE LONG TO SEE GOD'S FACE

"Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face." This antiphon for today's responsorial psalm offers the focus for today's readings. As we on earth celebrate the triumph of all the saints--the ones officially canonized by the Church, and the countless others who have also reached heaven--we add nothing to their glory. But we give ourselves reason to hope. We too long to see the face of God and believe that we can one day be counted among those whose robes, as John tells us in the book of Revelation, are washed "white in the blood of the Lamb."

The passage from John's First Letter offers further assurance: we are God's children who will one day see God. But today's Gospel pulls us past longing and reassurance into action. Jesus clearly tells us what we must do to be counted among the saints. We must be poor in spirit, hungry for holiness, merciful, single-hearted, and peacemakers! Then we too will see the face of God.
