### **GIVING ALL**

Trusting widows play a significant role in this weekend's readings. At the point of poverty, when giving even the smallest amount of what they had could imperil their health and well-being, they trusted God and gave anyway. What is important about their giving is not what or how much they gave, but how they gave it. Without selfishness, they gave to help others. Their giving was from the heart, with little hope or intention of receiving any sort of reward or recognition for their generosity. The monetary values of the widows' gifts were small, but their value measured in the Kingdom was priceless.

There is a significant similarity between their gift and the gift Jesus gave each of us. The widows offered their lives for God. Jesus offered his life for us.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION** In 1974, a revised ritual of penance was given to the Church, and at forty years distance, we still are discovering its treasures and tentative about some of its provisions. The rite reaches deep into our tradition for an early insight: when we turn to God, we are restored to life in the Church. There are three different forms of penance. The familiar individual confession is preserved, but with tremendous enrichment. It is less rushed, anchored by a reading from scripture, and the confession of sins is seen as an opportunity to proclaim faith in God's power to save. In a sense, what is "confessed" is the penitent's faith in God's gift of forgiveness. The priest suggests a penance that may be directly connected to the virtue that the person seeks as a means of overcoming the fault. There are formulas for contrition suggested, but the penitent might even express sorrow for sin and desire for mercy in his or her own words. The prayer of absolution grounds the event in the life and ministry of the Church. Harking back to the joyful dance of bishops leading penitents into the church, the rite now ends with a prayer of thanksgiving for God's mercy, and may include the gesture of laying on of hands. After forty years, we struggle to claim this rite forged of memory, tradition, and grace. History tells us to be patient; we do not always recognize a treasure at first. - Rev. ### ***A Message from the Director of Child and Youth Protection***

You may be aware of a movie soon to be released that chronicles the *Boston Globe's* investigation and subsequent reporting in 2002 of the child sexual abuse scandal in the Archdiocese of Boston. The following are some things to consider in light of the movie's release:

- The sexual abuse scandal has been a difficult, painful moment in the Church's history. It has been painful for victims/survivors, painful for their families and painful for the Church.
- Because of the courage of victims/survivors, this issue was brought to light.
- Since 2002, the Catholic Church has taken numerous steps to address child sexual abuse:
  - a. Created the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*
  - b. Supported better understanding of abuse through research (*Nature and Scope* and *Causes and Context*)
  - c. Continues to take a greater role, both within the Church and in society, in the prevention of child sexual abuse through education and awareness
  - d. Pope Francis has created a Pontifical Commission to address the issue world-wide.
    - Child sexual abuse is still prevalent in our society. Studies suggest that 1 out of 4 girls and 1 out of 6 boys are sexually abused before their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. Child sexual abuse continues to happen in our society, and this is a reminder that we cannot afford to become complacent.
    - Victims/survivors may be reminded of traumatic events in their lives by the movie. Providing support to all abuse victims is an act of charity and love we are called to provide.
    - The Church teaches that all human life is precious and is to be protected at all levels.

### **What we have done in The Diocese of Jefferson City:**

- Our diocese has participated in each annual Charter audit and has been found compliant with the Charter following each audit. Following the close of the current audit period (June 30, 2016) we will publish an annual report providing an update on the year's activities.
- Our diocese has participated each year in the survey conducted by CARA, which provides an annual report regarding allegations of abuse, child and youth protection efforts, and victim assistance efforts in our country.
- From March 1, 2003 to June 30, 2015 we have conducted 588 *Protecting God's Children* classes in the diocese. Through these classes, 13,820 adults have been given the education and resources to help keep children in our diocese safe.
- We provided education and training to over six thousand students in our Catholic schools and PSR programs during the past year. This training provides our youth with the knowledge and tools they need to stay safe.
- While numbers are not available for the period 2003-2006, since July 2007 we have conducted over 8400 background checks on employees and volunteers.
- We continue to work with victims/survivors of abuse to assist them in their healing process.
- Individuals and organizations outside of the Church are now looking to our diocese to provide support in educating about child abuse awareness and prevention.
