WILLIAM H. (Bill) SIMON SCHOLARSHIP

The William H. (Bill) Simon Scholarship Fund awards scholarships to Catholic students who are in financial need for the purpose of attending an accredited college or university of the student's choice. The scholarship is \$ 1,000 per semester to assist the student in meeting educational needs. Scholarship funds are paid directly to the institution or to the student upon presentation of receipts paid to the institution for tuition, fees, and/or room and board. It is the intent to award three new scholarships each year; however, the actual number of new awards will be contingent upon the current number of previous recipients that are eligible for renewal.

The deadline for submission of the application, SAR, and letters of recommendation is **March 31, 2016** (if sending via post, it must be postmarked by March 31, 2016). All applicants will be notified of the results by May 1, 2016. Pick up an application at the parish office!

STEWARDSHIP meeting Minutes Jan 26, 2016 Fr Mike opened the meeting with a Prayer at 6:00pm, followed by the scripture reading. Our theme for this month is MERCY and our patron saint is St Francis of Assisi.

John Watkins head of our technology review committee presented the website we have been reviewing and explained the advantages. He answered questions and after some discussion it was concluded that we will move forward with John, representatives of the school and office, and verify current set up of systems, costs and compare. That committee will come to a final conclusion and confirm their recommendations to Stewardship at our Feb meeting.

Janice Rupp updated us on the status of the retreat progress. She requested volunteers to assist as table leaders. We have 154 registrations with a couple pending. We are pleased with the interest and excited for this retreat. Volunteers need to be at St Michael's Hall at 7:30am on Feb 6th. We will open the doors for registrations at 8:00 am with coffee and donuts in St Michael's hall.

DeAnne announced Lay Witness statements will continue one Sunday each month rotating through the Mass times. Chuck and Judy Spratt are preparing for an Evangelization program "Inviting Catholics Home" a 6 week program typically following Easter, Christmas, and one in the fall. A team will be interviewed to include 5-6 members of the Church to roll out this program.

2016 Lenten Regulations & Admonitions for the Diocese of Jefferson City

As another Lenten journey of conversion begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10, 2016, and ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 24, 2016, Holy Mother Church calls all Catholics to a deeper spirit of penance, fasting, almsgiving and prayer, "which express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others" (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 1434 & 1969). In order to foster a greater spirit of penance, of reparation for sin, to encourage self-denial, and so guide us more closely in the footsteps of Christ, Holy Mother Church reminds us of the following **obligations of fast and abstinence** during Lent and also **admonishes us all to deeper prayer and worship.**

1. **Abstinence**: all persons who have already celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.
2. **Fasting**: everyone, from the celebration of their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent is highly recommended. But please note: when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. These are minimal penitential practices and should not be lightly excused. If in doubt, please consult your parish priest. Other recommended forms of fasting, as regards alcoholic drink, needless television, video games, internet use, and social entertainment, are of true spiritual value and strongly encouraged.
3. **Almsgiving**: The act of giving to the poor, in the most ancient tradition of the Church, is an expression of penance, a witness of fraternal charity, and an expression of Lenten conversion. Therefore, all Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church: through regular stewardship to their parish, support of charities, and their generous response to the diocesan Catholic Stewardship Appeal.
4. **Prayer**: In order to deepen one's love for Christ, Catholics are urged all the more to participate in the Sacramental life of the Church during Lent by attending daily **Mass** and frequenting the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.
