## HAVE YOU NOTICED?

The Alleluia is suspiciously missing. And the Gloria, a song of joy and exultation, is gone, too. Why so? "Alleluia" is Hebrew: Hallelujah! Praise the Lord! It is a means of expressing great joy and reminds us that the Kingdom of Heaven is firmly established for us. During the Lenten season, however, we focus on the Kingdom that is to come rather than the Kingdom having already come.

The exceptions for this are the Solemnity of St. Joseph on March 19, and the Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday. Omitting these joyful responses during this penitential season reinforces the emphasis of our solemn preparation for the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ as we enter Holy Week, when we again proclaim joyfully, "He is Risen!"

## ***OPERATION RICE BOWL* SUNDAY REFLECTION: Week 3: February 28**

**Sacredness and Dignity of the Human Person** When God created us, he made us in his image and likeness. That means that every human being has a special value and purpose. We need to care for each other so that we can be the people God calls us to be.

■ Isaiah beautifully describes the invitation of grace God extends to each of us. We are reminded that our inherent dignity means that God lives in us and desires that we stay close to him.

### **How does this invitation from God guide us in our relationships with one another?**

■ Jesus' parable of the fig tree reminds us to cultivate our own lives, and those of others. We should not cut anyone down but rather build each other up. **How do we cultivate the Spirit at work in those around us?**

■ This week, CRS Rice Bowl features a woman from Rwanda who, understanding the importance of good nutrition for her child, worked to ensure that her baby received the nutrition she needs from conception to her second birthday. **How do we work to protect life in all its forms, from conception to natural death?**

**"I AM"** Kindness and mercy are what the enslaved people of Israel needed, and they came in the form of deliverance. They came through a leader, Moses, who was once plucked from the Nile River and was now herding his father-in-law's sheep in the land of Goshen. The bush that burned but was not consumed shows us that God is inexhaustible mystery. Moses' awe and deference are mixed with a touching conversational tone as he seeks to learn God's name. And God sweetly responds. The somewhat abstract "I AM" distinguishes the God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob from the minor gods in the territory who "are not." They are helpless, powerless, and useless. Moses is to step out into an amazing future, and God will be there with outstretched arm. Just go and see, God seems to say.

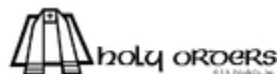
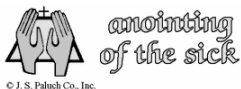
