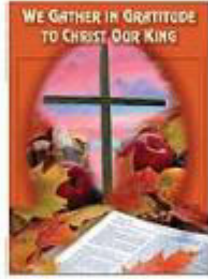

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I began writing this letter before the election thinking that, no matter who wins, there is something greater at stake. This has been a bitter and divisive campaign; cynical about the democracy it is supposed to represent and the people it is meant to serve. No matter who wins, there will be millions of people genuinely fearful for the future.

The first thing is to take a deep breath. From the ashes of war, economic depression, and natural disaster, our country has emerged much stronger. The crisis of a presidential election pales in comparison to the actual horrors of the past and we will survive it.

Where we go from here is not solely dependent on who occupies the Oval Office. Voting is not our only civic duty. As good citizens we should be involved. As Christians, we should be biased, not for political parties, but for the common good. The election is over but our work has just begun to better our community, to serve those on the periphery, and to promote those values of our faith that our world so desperately lacks.

Finally, we must drop to our knees and confess that our needs are great. We pray for the courage to forgive the sins and transgressions of this campaign. We pray for acceptance of one another and the unity we will need to go on. We pray that God will bless our country by leading each of us in ways that will help it heal and prosper.

We say that we are "one nation under God, indivisible." Now is our chance to prove it.
