HOLY FAMILY PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES - OCTOBER 10, 2017

Present: Fr. Mike Quinn, Fr. Pat Dolan, Marisa Ellison, Libby Manning, Richie Fogle, Brent Massie, Olivia Clark, Aaron Hays and Barb Steinman

Marisa called the meeting to order at 5:19 p.m. Fr. Mike opened the meeting with a prayer.

Fr. Mike reported that the city is looking at closing Maple Street off (around the school playground area) and making part of it a green space. The city will be presenting a discussion on this at the upcoming School Board meeting.

Fr. Pat has been researching how to reach out to the immigrants in the area. He has recruited Jesus Martin to serve on the Parish Council. Looking at sources that know where immigrants may live, etc., such as HLGU, School records, employment to use as a means to reach out. He reported there are 71 Hispanic students in Marion County.

Libby reported on the Stewardship committee. Committee is still devising a calendar listing parish events. Fr. Mike reported that Linda Dinges has agreed to lead the Grief Ministry. This ministry will start after the first of the year. Committee is looking at getting lay witness talks started up again. They have arranged for a mission to be given by Fr. John Doctor on November 7th.

Fr. Mike reported the Inviting Catholics Home campaign is starting and the committee is making personal phone calls to get people interested. He also reviewed the pastoral plan that was developed by the parish last year and sent to the Diocese.

Social Media Outreach – Committee working on his area

Faith/Youth – Middle School Youth Group and Confirmation leaders are established. Still looking at ways to support teens transitioning from high school to college.

Faith/Adults- Mission planned for November 7th. Fr. Dolan indicated we are moving from “maintenance to mission” and from “monument to movement” in our direction. It was suggested the parish needs to consider another program such as CRHP or Alpha to continue the movement.

Richie reported that the parish picnic was a success.

Recording secretary, Barb Steinman, will be retiring in January, so the Parish Council will be seeking a new recording secretary. This is a non-voting, yet very important, position.

Brent reminded everyone that the Knights would have their fish sandwiches at the upcoming Folklife Festival.

It was reported that approximately \$4,600 was made by the Good Neighbor Quarter Madness event. The youth garage sale was a success and the leftover items were taken to Holy Rosary in Monroe City for the Right to Life sale.

Parish Council Report – Sister Mary

RCIA is going well. There are 10 individual preparing along with their sponsors.

Religious Ed. - There are 60 students enrolled representing 40 families.

We have several new catechists this year.

Tuesday Evening Group - The 6 week video series **Pivotal Players** by **Bishop Barron** has begun with about 30 individuals attending. The group consists of a combination of former RCIA candidates and sponsors and a number of other individuals.

Carolyn Saucier will be speaking on October 18 on the topic – **The Gift and the work of Eucharist/ Evangelization**. Her presentation will be at 6:30 PM in the upper level of the parish center. Sign-up is currently taking place.

Virtus - (safe environment training) will be held Tuesday, October 24 at 6:30 PM in St. Michael's Hall. All who are working with the youth are required to attend.

Advent Retreat Evening –Fr. John Doctor will be our presenter for an Advent Retreat Evening on Tuesday, Nov. 7 at 7PM.

The **Word Among Us** has been ordered for the seasons of Advent and Lent as a means for spiritual growth for our parishioners.

Meeting adjourned at 6:10 p.m. with Fr. Pat closing the meeting with a prayer.
