NEW FISCAL YEAR... Thanks to everyone for your generous donations during the 2015-16 fiscal year. While we ended over for our yearly offertory budget there are some expenditures that will deplete this reserve fairly quickly. One would be \$23,000-\$25,000 for heaters in our school gym that need to be replaced. The money will also help defer the rising cost of utilities and insurance for the parish. The remainder will be placed into our reserve fund for other needs that may arise in the future.

DIOCESAN MISSION COLLECTION APPEAL - JULY 16-17

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the Gospel, we hear the familiar story of the Good Samaritan. After the lawyer correctly identifies the neighbor as "the one who showed him mercy," Jesus tells him, "Go and do likewise."

This is a call to action, to mission, to evangelization - a good reminder before next weekend's Diocesan Mission Collection.

"Who are the first to whom the Gospel message must be proclaimed?" Pope Francis asks in his *Joy of the Gospel*. He assures us, "The answer, so often found throughout the Gospel, is clear: it is the poor, the little ones and the sick, those who are often looked down upon or forgotten, those who cannot repay us."

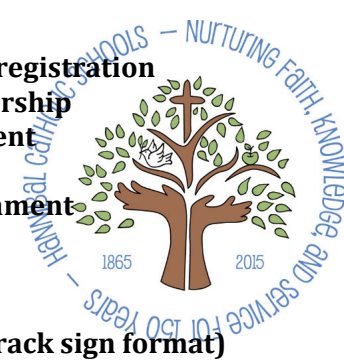
During the past year, your mission donations have spread the Gospel by serving these poor. We have gone and done likewise in bandaging wounds, aiding the helpless, giving food, shelter, and community to those in need.

We've fed hungry children in Peru and Mexico. We've funded clinics in the barrios of Lima and the tribal lands of India. There is another well in Nigeria and new life among sugarcane workers in the Philippines. It is all because we believe what is echoed in our Church from Jesus to Pope Francis: "the poor must be attended to and nourished."

What we are able to do in the future depends on your generosity next weekend. Once we realize the "inseparable bond between our faith and the poor," we have no choice but to "Go and do likewise."
