Dear Friends in Christ,

In our country, there is an urgency for sharing the message of Christ and the beauty of the Church. The Catholic Home Missions Appeal (CHMA) on April 28-29 is one important way in which we can respond. This appeal supports U.S. mission dioceses that do not have the resources to meet the basic pastoral needs of their people.

The mountainous, isolating geography of the Diocese of Pueblo has shaped the attitude of pastors and parishioners alike. They tend to be highly independent. This has served them well, since only 44 priests and 45 deacons are available to serve the needs of over 64,000 Catholics.

The diocese is rural, covering the entire southern half of Colorado. With your support of CHMA, the Diocese of Pueblo offers lay ministry training programs. Graduates assist pastors serving the most isolated parishes in everything from catechesis to visiting the sick and elderly.

Our diocese is another example of those benefitting from Catholic Home Missions. We receive an annual grant to help us provide formation and other pastoral services to Hispanics in our parish communities.

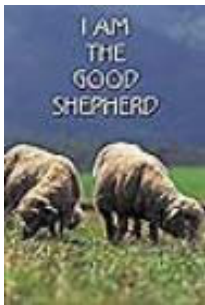
WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS - APRIL 22, 2018

God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve in your Son's Kingdom as priests, deacons, religious, and consecrated persons. SUNDAY SOUNDBITES ... One of my seminary classmates has always reacted when the story of the Good Shepherd was read. "I don't like being compared to sheep!" he said. "They're dumb, and smelly too!"



I grew up in the city, so my experience with sheep is limited. But I do know that shepherding was an important part of life for the people of Biblical times. It's the relationship between shepherd and sheep that makes Jesus' comparison work.

The shepherds of Jesus' time herded their flocks through wilderness, ready to defend them from attack by wild animals. In a crowded sheepfold at night, shepherds of several flocks herded together could identify their own sheep—and vice versa!

Jesus' listeners would have understood the economic interdependence of shepherd and sheep—a truly good shepherd would value each and every individual in his flock.

The relationship Jesus offers us is one characterized by the dignity and worth he sees in each of us. He knows each of us by name, with an intimacy he shares with us from the Father, whom Jesus knows with the intimacy of a Divine Son. And the bottom line: Jesus gives his life for us, his flock.

My classmate and I still chuckle about his reaction to being "herded together" in this Biblical image. But we both agree: We want to be counted among the Lord's flock!

Sunday Soundbites is a weekly, 90-second radio homily based on the Sunday readings, written and read by Franciscan Father Greg Friedman. Sunday Soundbites is also heard on Catholic radio stations around the country.

ROOTED IN BAPTISM:

Today gives us the opportunity to take the time to pray for those who lead us in ordained ministry. In this time of crisis in the Church, our bishops, deacons, and priests need our support as they continue to embrace their vocation to do as Saint Peter did—to point others to the Lord. Since all vocations are rooted in the sacrament of baptism, it is good for us to remember that it was at the moment of our baptism that we became Christ for others. Each of us is called to become more and more like the Good Shepherd as we learn to live out our baptismal call. As we make our way along the Christian journey, we need nourishment and guidance from those appointed to be our shepherds. We need to pray that God will strengthen those who have become weary. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, let us pray especially for the ordained and all those called to point us to the Lord.
